

- **So, what about Evangelism**

- The word evangelism is not found in the bible!

- Origin of the word evangelism - 1620s, "the preaching of the gospel," from [evangel](#) + [-ism](#), or else from Medieval Latin evangelismus "a spreading of the Gospel," from Late Latin evangelium "good news, gospel," from Greek euangelion

- The term evangelist is only found twice and evangelists once!

- Acts 21:8 ...the house of Philip the evangelist
- 2 Timothy 4:5 do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.
- Ephesians 4:11 Apostles, Prophets, Evangelist, Shepherds, Teachers

- **What about the Great Commission?**

- **Matthew 28:18-20** Jesus came and told his disciples, "I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. 19 Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. 20 Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."
- **Mark 16:15-16** And then he told them, "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone. 16 Anyone who believes and is baptized will be saved. But anyone who refuses to believe will be condemned.

• Discourse, Dilemma and Divide - Evangelicalism

- **Evangelicalism** traces its roots to Jesus of Nazareth. Since the term "evangelical" derives from the Greek word for "good news" or "gospel," evangelicals look to the New Testament accounts of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and the ensuing evangelistic ministries of his disciples as the origin of their movement.
- Evangelicalism has been shaped by three significant periods of modern Christianity:
 - First, the Protestant Reformation of the sixteenth century and especially its expression in English Puritanism;
 - Four questions were: what must a person do to be saved? where does religious authority lie? what is the church? and what is the essence of Christian living?
 - Second, the evangelical revivals of the eighteenth century. The evangelical call for an instantaneous conversion to Christ continued through the nineteenth century in camp meetings and revivals and classrooms all across America.
 - Third, the conservative reaction to modern America in the twentieth century, often called fundamentalism.
 - **Fundamentalism** emphasizes authority and fixed creeds in religion; **modernism** emphasizes freedom and progress in religious thought.

• Jesus and the Harvest

- **John 4:34-38** Then Jesus explained: "My nourishment comes from doing the will of God, who sent me, and from finishing his work. 35 You know the saying, 'Four months between planting and harvest.' But I say, wake up and look around. The fields are already ripe for harvest. 36 The harvesters are paid good wages, and the fruit they harvest is people brought to eternal life. What joy awaits both the planter and the harvester alike! 37 You know the saying, 'One plants and another harvests.' And it's true. 38 **I sent you to harvest where you didn't plant; others had already done the work, and now you will get to gather the harvest.**"
- **Matthew 9:35-38** Jesus traveled through all the towns and villages of that area, teaching in the synagogues and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom. And he healed every kind of disease and illness. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them because they were confused and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 He said to his disciples, "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. 38 **So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest;** ask him to send more workers into his fields."
- **Luke 10:1-4** The Lord now chose seventy-two other disciples and sent them ahead in pairs to all the towns and places he planned to visit. 2 These were his instructions to them: "The harvest is great, but the workers are few. **So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest;** ask him to send more workers into his fields. 3 Now go, and remember that I am sending you out as lambs among wolves. 4 Don't take any money with you, nor a traveler's bag, nor an extra pair of sandals. And don't stop to greet anyone on the road.
