




He Rose from the Grave

What are the Chances?

He is no longer here



Review:

- Isaiah 53 describes 24 actions the Messiah would experience that were all fulfilled in Jesus during Holy Week.
- Peter Stoner – if just 8 - **1 in 100,000,000,000,000**
- Zechariah 9:9 Rejoice, O people of Zion! Shout in triumph, O people of Jerusalem! Look, your king is coming to you. He is righteous and victorious, yet he is humble, riding on a donkey—riding on a donkey's colt. NLT
- **What are the Chances**
- “Jesus’ fulfillment of the Old Testament Scriptures on Palm Sunday is recorded in all four New Testament Gospel Accounts: Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-44, and John 12:12-19.

Resurrection Sunday

- **Talk About What are the Chances???**
 - What are the Chances that anyone could fulfill 48 prophecies of Scripture?
 - In His life, Jesus not only fulfilled 48 prophecies in His death. He fulfilled 332 prophecies in His life.
- ***Jesus wasn't revived, He was resurrected.***
- Jesus came back to life,
 - proving God is powerful.
 - Demonstrating that Jesus was and is who He said He was.
 - And that there really is life after death.



- **Isaiah 53:10** ^{TLB}

But it was the Lord's good plan to bruise him and fill him with grief. (That's Good Friday.)

However, when his soul has been made an offering for sin,
(That happened at the crucifixion.)

then he shall have a multitude of children, many heirs.
(That's us!)

He shall live again, (that's the Resurrection!)

and God's program shall prosper in his hands. (God's program is the church. With branches in every nation of the world today, it's doing very well, thank you.)

- **Isaiah 53:11** And when he sees all that is accomplished by the anguish of his soul, he shall be satisfied; and because of what he has experienced, my righteous Servant shall make many to be counted righteous before God, for he shall bear all their sins. TLB

Luke 24:1-12

- *What happened on Resurrection Sunday?*
 1. *Just before dawn, three named women went to the tomb to finish dressing Jesus' body.* Luke 24:1-12; Mark 16:1
 2. *While on the way, there was an earthquake.* Matt. 28:2-3
 3. *Angels announced that Jesus was risen.* Luke 24:4;
John 20:12 and Matthew 28:2-3
 4. *The women reported the news to the Disciples.* Luke 24:9-10
 5. *On the way to report, they encountered Jesus in the flesh.*
Matthew 28:8-10



- 6. *The Disciples didn't believe their report.*** Luke 24:11
- 7. *Peter and John investigated the tomb for themselves.***
Luke 24:12; John 20:3-11

What are the Chances?

- 8. *Jesus revealed Himself to two disciples on the road to Emmaus.***
Luke 24:13-34

But Wait, We Are Not Quite Finished Yet

- 9. *Jesus came to the Disciples in the evening!*** Luke 24:36
John 20:19



10. Jesus walked through the wall to get to them. John 20:19

11. Jesus showed them His wounds. Luke 24:39-40; John 20:20

12. Jesus ate with them. Luke 24:41-43

13. It seems now that Jesus had their full attention He explained the Scriptures to them. Luke 24:46-49

14. The Disciples rejoiced and believed. John. 20:20b

**15. Jesus breathed on them to receive.
the Holy Spirit and authority!**

John 20:21-23



Quite a Day !!!!

Jesus rose from the dead, met with and proved Himself to no less than 16 people, including 4 women, 10 Apostles (Judas had deserted, and Thomas wasn't there on that first Sunday), plus the 2 other disciples on the road to Emmaus.

The Resurrection changed everything. It means that there really is life after death, and God has made a way for us to get there.
